Gardyne, a director of Wellington practice architecture+, was awarded the Gold Medal for an outstanding body of significant works that includes City Gallery Wellington, Te Wharewaka o Poneke-Te Raukura on Wellington waterfront, Spark Central, Conservation House, Pataka-Porirua Museum of Arts, and Hutt City administration building. Smaller, residential works include Morrison's Bush Cabin and Ponatahi House

In March this year, the 2016 NZIA Aon New Zealand Gold Medal Tour will take Gardyne to eight centres: Auckland, New Plymouth, Hamilton, Nelson, Christchurch, Dunedin, Napier and Wellington. The talks are free and all are welcome. Full event details for each centre can be viewed <u>here</u>.
