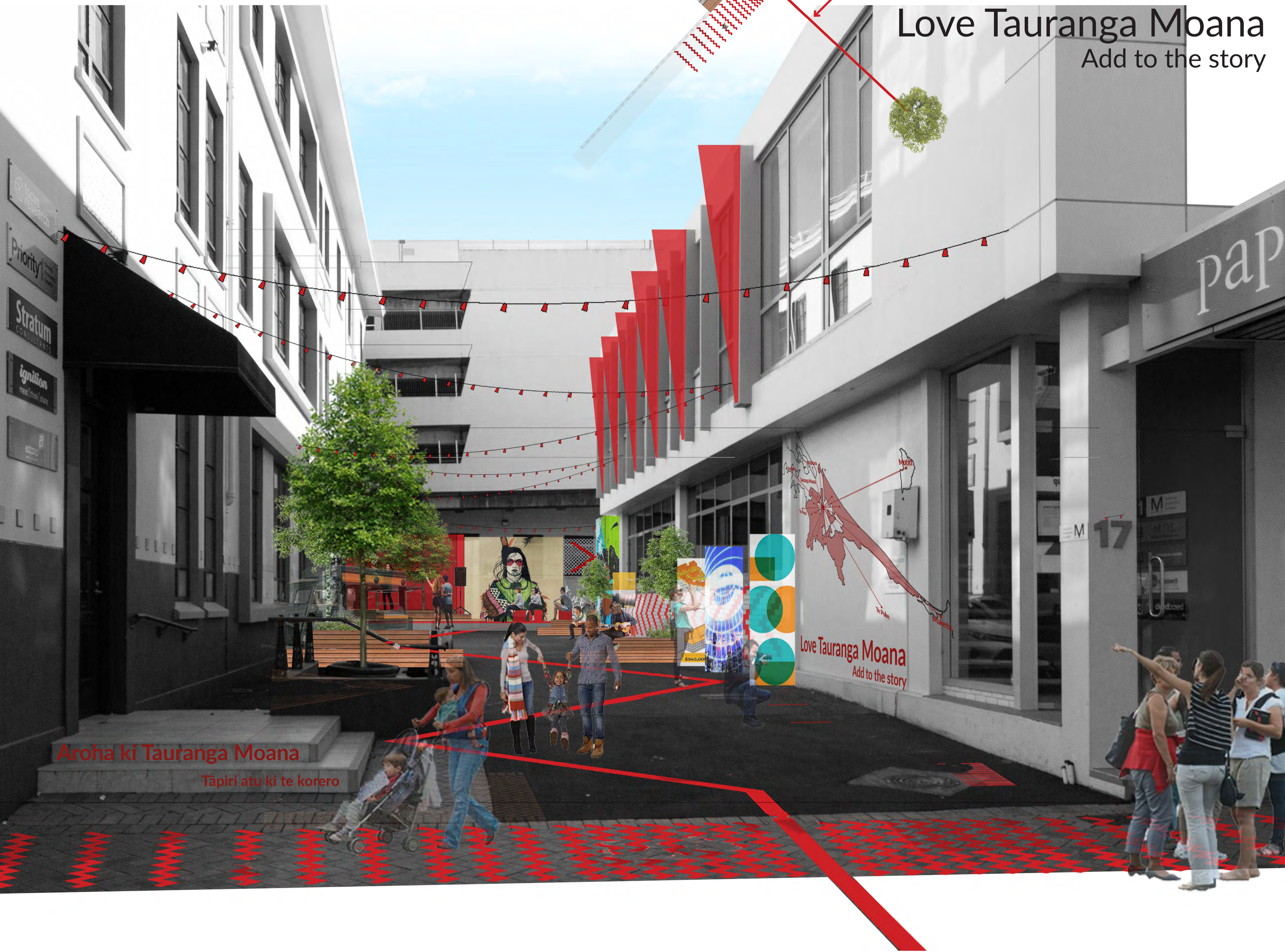
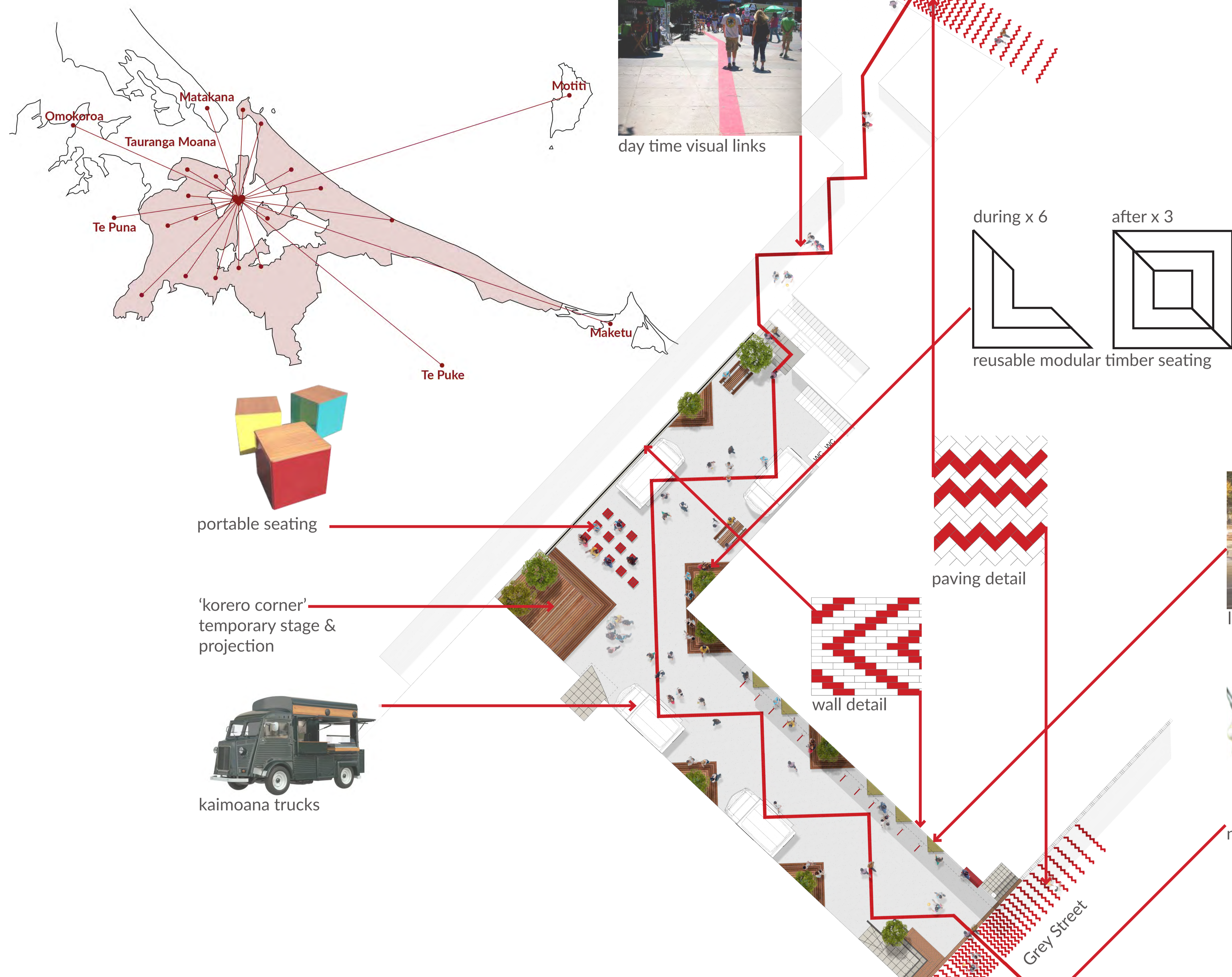
Creating a flexible space that promotes public interaction and engagement, a place for professionals and the public to speak and be heard.

The response aims to provide platforms for displaying and presenting ideas. This is realised through the provision of a temporary stage and projector in 'korero corner', illuminated display boards, and chalk drawing on the concrete wall to the rear of the laneway. Supporting imagery and video can also be projected onto the carpark wall.

Triangular timber bleacher-style seating allows placement of temporary trees and points of relaxation. Following the festivals these seats can be combined to form 3 large square seating areas that could be donated to The Strand waterfront in time for summer. These could be permanently planted with the 3 large trees used along the rear wall, contributing to the 'greening' of the developing waterfront precinct.

Red paint responds to the brick pavement and wall detailing, while a continuous line highlights the access from Grey Street to Spring Street.

Above the ground plane festoon-style lighting reinforces this strong connection through illumination at night.
